#### ANDERSON UNIVERSITY

- One scholarship available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years); Scholarship used in conjunction with federal, state, institutional grants to equal full tuition
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA
- Test scores: 1050 (SAT); 22 (ACT)
- Interview on campus is required
- Submit admissions application to Anderson University by November 18
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by March 10

#### BALL STATE UNIVERSITY

- Three scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- <u>Submit admissions application to Ball State University and complete the</u> <u>Honors College application by November 1</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form



#### BUTLER UNIVERSITY

- Three scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years; 5 years if student is part of the Engineering Dual Degree Program)
- High School GPA: 3.20 GPA
- Test scores: 1650 (OLD SAT w/writing); 1190 (NEW SAT); 25 (ACT)
- Interview will be requested
- <u>Submit complete admissions application to Butler University by November 1</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form (strongly recommended)
- Students who have taken a leadership role promoting diversity and inclusion in their schools or communities are also encouraged to apply for Butler University's Dr. John Morton-Finney Leadership Award at (<u>https://www.butler.edu/diversity/morton-finney-leadership-program</u>)

# CENTRAL STATE UNIVERSITY

- Two scholarships available
- Award: \$6000
- High School GPA: 3.5 GPA on 4.0 scale
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- Submit admissions application to Central State University by December 1
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by January 31<sup>st</sup>

#### **CORNERSTONE UNIVERSITY**

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Partial to Full Tuition (4 years)
- Assistance towards: Tuition, Fees, Room/Board, & Books
- High School GPA: 2.5 GPA
- Test scores: 1000 (SAT); 19 (ACT)
- Submit admissions application to Cornerstone University no later than January 15.
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form no later than February 15



#### DEPAUW UNIVERSITY

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.5 GPA (unweighted)
- Test scores: 1100 (SAT); 26 (ACT)
- Submit admissions application to DePauw University by December 1.
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form

# EARLHAM COLLEGE

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full demonstrated need met (4 years, for undergraduate study)
- High School GPA: 3.6 GPA or higher on a 4.0 scale
- Test scores: 1150 critical reading + math (SAT); 25 (ACT)
- Submit admissions application to Earlham College by November 1.
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form

# FRANKLIN COLLEGE

- One scholarship available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA
- Test scores: 1000 (SAT) and 20 (ACT)
- <u>Submit admissions application to Franklin College by Priority Deadline-</u> December 1. Application fees waived.
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by February 15



# GRACE COLLEGE

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA
- Test scores: At College's Discretion
- <u>Submit admissions application to Grace College by Priority Deadline -</u> <u>November 1.</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by March 1 for priority

#### HANOVER COLLEGE

- One scholarship available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 or Higher
- Test Scores: At College's Discretion
- <u>Submit admissions application to Hanover College by December 1</u>
  <u>Application fees waived</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by February 15

#### INDIANA STATE UNIVERSITY

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- Evidence of involvement in school/community leadership & volunteerism
- <u>Submit admissions application to Indiana State University</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form



#### INDIANA UNIVERSITY

- The number of scholarships awarded varies annually
- Award: \$10,000 (available for four years, if student maintains 3.0 cumulative GPA) (year 2-4), Dell or Apple laptop; \$1,000 for study abroad
- High School GPA: 3.2 GPA on a 4.0 scale(weighted)
- Test scores: 1170 (SAT)-Math & Verbal; 24 (ACT)
- Submit admissions application to IU by November 1, (note on the application that you are a CLD student, acceptance to IU is a prerequisite)
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form

#### IUPUI-INDIANAPOLIS

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition & \$8000 Housing Stipend
- High School GPA 3.0 / Diversity Essay
- Test Scores: 1050 (SAT); 21 (ACT)
- Submit admissions application to IUPUI-Indianapolis by November 15
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form

# Indiana Wesleyan University

- One scholarship available
- Award: Full Tuition renewable for 8 consecutive semesters and membership in the Luther Lee Scholars Cohort of intercultural leaders
- Be able to attend the interview day on January 26<sup>th</sup>, or attend an alternate interview day if selected as a finalist.
- Meet one of the following criteria:
  - Rank in the top 10 percent of graduating class -or-
  - GPA of 3.6 or higher (on a 4.0 scale)
- Consideration for the Luther Lee Scholars cohort considers academic achievement, community leadership involvement, and scholar-leader's vision for social justice
- Complete application for admission to IWU by January 10
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by January 10



# IVY TECH COMMUNITY COLLEGE

- Two scholarships available
- Award: 65 credit hour renewable scholarships (must be used in 3 years)
- Community service (no minimum hours, but continuous)
- Maintain Satisfactory Academic Progress (cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher and completion rate of 67%)
- <u>Submit admissions application to Ivy Tech Community College;</u> <u>Application free online</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by February 15

#### MARIAN UNIVERSITY

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA
- Test scores: 1000 (SAT, Critical Reading & Math); 1080 (New 2016 SAT, Critical Reading & Math); 22 (ACT)
- <u>Submit admissions application to Marian University by December 1</u>
  <u>Application fees waived</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by April 15

# NORTH CAROLINA A&T STATE UNIVERSITY

- One scholarship available
- Award: Up to Full Tuition , Fees, Room & Board (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.75 GPA
- Test scores: 1200 (SAT); 1270 (Redesigned SAT); (M & ERW); 26 (ACT)
- <u>Submit admissions application to North Carolina A&T State University by</u>
  <u>December 1</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form



# PURDUE UNIVERSITY

- Ten or more scholarships available
- Award: Various amounts that are renewable for up to 4 years
- High School GPA: 3.0 or Higher
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- Must have an interview with Purdue Representative(s)
- Submit admissions application to Purdue University by December 1
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form

#### **ROSE-HULMAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY**

- 1 5 Scholarships Available
- Award: Meet full demonstrated financial need, up to cost of attendance. Support will come through need and/or merit-institutional scholarship, federal and/or state grants, Federal Direct loans, private scholarships, and/or student employment
- Student must be ranked in Top 15% of High School Class
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- <u>Submit admissions application to Rose-Hulman by November 1 for Restrictive</u> <u>Early Action or February 1 for Regular Decision</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form and participate in Academic Merit Scholarship Selection Weekend

#### SAINT MARY OF-THE-WOODS COLLEGE

- Three scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (8 semesters)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA (on a 4.0 scale)
- Test scores: 1000 (SAT); 21 (ACT)
- Campus visit by January 15<sup>th</sup> is required, while participation in the Pomeroy Scholarship Day event December 2<sup>nd</sup> is recommended
- <u>Submit complete admissions application and unofficial high school transcript</u> by December 1, submission by November 1<sup>st</sup> is recommended
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by January 1



# TAYLOR UNIVERSITY

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 or Higher
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- Faith commitment (expressed relationship with Christ)
- Submit admissions application to Taylor University; Application fees waived
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by February 15

# UNIVERSITY OF EVANSVILLE

- Three (3) scholarships available
- Award: Each scholarship is valued at full-tuition for four (4) years provided standard of academic progress is met
- High School GPA: 3.20 GPA
- Test scores: 1100 (2-Part SAT); 24 (ACT)-Test Optional Available
- Full-time enrollment required; 2 year on-campus residency required
- Campus visit highly encouraged
- Submit complete admissions application by December 1
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form no later than March 1 but preferably sooner

# UNIVERSITY OF INDIANAPOLIS

- Two scholarships available
- Award: Full Tuition (4 years)
- High School GPA: 3.0 GPA or greater
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- Have a campus visit with the Scholarship Committee
- Scholarship may be renewed with a cumulative grade point average of 2.7 or greater and successful completion of 30 credit hours each year
- <u>Submit admissions application to University of Indianapolis by December 1;</u>
  <u>Application fees waived</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by the Indiana filing deadline (currently April 15)



#### UNIVERSITY OF NOTRE DAME

- No fixed number of scholarships
- Award: Meet full demonstrated financial need, up to cost of attendance. Support will come through need and/or merit-institutional scholarship, federal and/or state grants, Federal Direct loans, private scholarships, and/or student employment
- No set high school GPA (48% of students in this year's freshman class were in the top 1% of their high school class)
- Test Scores: At University's Discretion
- <u>Submit admissions application to University of Notre Dame by November 1</u>
  <u>for Restrictive Early Action or January 1 for Regular Decision</u>
- Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form and the CSS/Financial Aid PROFILE

# VINCENNES UNIVERSITY

- One scholarship available (up to \$6000/yr.)
- Award: Assistance up to 4 years for tuition, fees and books
- High School GPA: 2.75 GPA or greater; Class Rank: Top 20% of class
- Test scores: 1010 SAT(math and verbal) or greater; 21 ACT or greater
- <u>Submit admissions application to Vincennes University</u>
  Complete and file the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) form by
  February 15

# WABASH COLLEGE

- One scholarship Available
- Award: Merit based scholarship awards up to \$30,000/year up to 4 years; Amounts based on student's GPA and test scores
- High School GPA: 3.5/4.0
- Test Scores: No minimum requirement
- Additional scholarships include: Wabash Lilly Award (Full-ride) and Honors Scholarships; require additional application and/or campus visit
